This report launches a new, youth-informed blueprint calling for a shift in how systems respond to young people experiencing family violence. Grounded in lived experience and frontline practice, the report highlights gaps in adult-centric, crisis-driven responses and outlines practical solutions for earlier, relational and developmentally appropriate support. It calls for leadership and investment to ensure young people are truly seen, safe and supported.

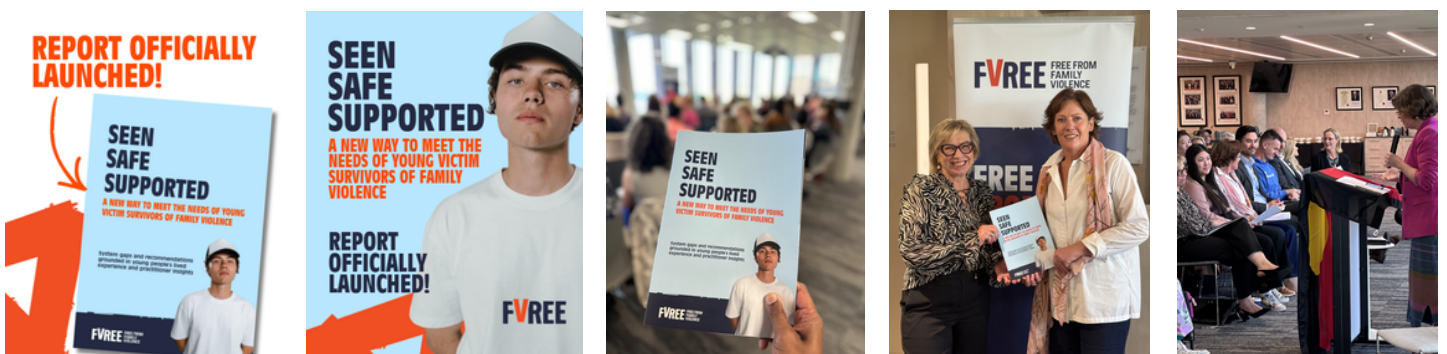
